Eligibility:

1. Applicants can be any student who is a permanent resident of Shelby County and a U.S. Citizen.
2. Applicants must be a current college student or a graduating high school senior.
3. Applicants who are graduating high school seniors must not have any “Good Conduct Violations” (cell phone violations are exempt).
4. Applicants must be enrolled full time for the 2019 Fall Semester at a 4-year college/university or a 2-year community college.
5. Must have a current GPA of 2.5 (either in high school or college) on a 4.0 scale. Preference will be given to a student pursuing a degree in the field of Library Science, Education, Journalism or English. If there are no applicants in this field, others will be considered.
6. Recipient of the grant will be required to complete 110 hours of volunteer work at the Harlan Community Library between June 1, 2019 and August 31, 2019. Volunteer work will consist of helping with Summer Library programs, planning and implementing programs, working at the circulation desk and other duties as assigned. Hours of volunteer work will mostly consist of M-F mornings, an occasional afternoon, evening and/or Saturday morning and scheduling will be at the discretion of the library director.

Scholarship Award:

1. Recipient must maintain a GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) during the Fall 2019 semester.
2. Scholarship will be paid directly to the college/university at the end of the Fall 2019 semester after the Foundation receives verification of GPA and completion of Fall 2019 semester.
